✓ ADVOCATE FOR ECONOMIC EQUITY

✓ CHAMPION OF EQUITY IN HEALTHCARE

Tens of millions of Americans remain underinsured or without any insurance whatsoever and historically, it is communities of color that have fallen through the cracks. Healthcare disparities – in treatment, research, and the labor force – continue to wreak havoc on our communities and will continue to do so until we can ensure all Americans have equitable access to quality, affordable healthcare.

✓ DEFENDING THE INTEGRITY OF OUR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Just as we must remain vigilant of bad actors seeking to use advances in technology to flood the digital realm with deepfakes and misinformation intended to inflame societal tensions and mislead. We must now confront growing efforts to weaponize the powers of government to erase our history, recontextualize the horrors of slavery, and roll back social progress at educational institutions across the country. From attacks on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion efforts at universities, to state-mandated book bans at public schools, and attacks on HBCUs, the CBC must be prepared to confront the litany of challenges facing our education systems.

✓ PROTECTOR OF DIGITAL CIVIL RIGHTS

The rapid proliferation of technological advancements presents exciting opportunities for the Black community. However, to capitalize on this progress, we must put forth forward-thinking policies to ensure the inequities of the past are not enshrined in the laws and technologies of the future.



✓ DEFENDER OF POLITICAL PARTICIPATION: Combatting Mis-, Dis-, and Mal-information

The Biden-Harris Administration's historic investment in broadband deployment and infrastructure allows Americans access to information and communication services at an unprecedented rate. Unfortunately, that also means it is all the more critical to ensure the quality and veracity of information being shared, particularly as it relates to education, housing, health care, and government services targeting immigrant and minority communities. Policymakers must give Americans the tools they need to combat assaults on our shared sense of reality.
